Guidelines for the Use of Artificial Intelligence Technology in Theses and Independent Study Reports, B.E. 2568 (2025)

Part 3

Advisor Guidelines

Article 7: During the preparation of the thesis or independent study report, the advisor should proceed as follows:

- (1) Define the scope of artificial intelligence technology use and the type of artificial intelligence technology together with the student, ensuring appropriateness for the thesis or independent study topic.
- (2) Provide necessary consultation regarding the use of artificial intelligence technology.
- (3) Periodically check the use of artificial intelligence technology by observing the student's writing style and language use to compare with each draft of the thesis or independent study report submitted by the student.
- (4) Store files or evidence of the thesis or independent study report.
- (5) Use oral questioning methods regarding the content of the thesis or independent study to verify the student's genuine academic ability and skills.
- (6) Verify the factual accuracy of the thesis or independent study content and the factual accuracy of the sources cited in the thesis or independent study report, using oral questioning methods to verify such factual accuracy.
- (7) Orally inquire about the student's analysis methods that rely on results from artificial intelligence technology to prove that the use of artificial intelligence technology is solely to support the preparation of the thesis or independent study report.

- (8) Check the thesis or independent study report using various artificial intelligence use detection tools, such as Grammarly, GPTZero, ZeroGPT, QuillBot, Copyleaks, Scribbr.
- (9) Carry out other actions in accordance with the university's principles and guidelines for the use of artificial intelligence technology.

Article 8: Before the thesis or independent study examination, the advisor should preliminarily check that the use of artificial intelligence technology is consistent with the details the student provided in the form attached to this announcement, and also sign the certification of verification on said form.

Article 9: In case the advisor detects an unacceptable use of artificial intelligence technology, the advisor should call the student in for clarification and have them correct it to be free of unacceptable artificial intelligence technology use. **Except in cases where it is a clear and serious violation affecting academic quality, the advisor may assign a "U" grade in the thesis or independent study course for the semester in which it was detected, and forward the matter to the program for further disciplinary action consideration.**

Part 4

Guidelines for the Thesis or Independent Study Examination Committee

Article 10: Before the thesis or independent study examination, the Thesis or Independent Study Examination Committee should proceed as follows:

- (1) Check the completeness of the details the student provided in the form attached to this announcement to use in considering the reasonableness of the artificial intelligence technology use. Also, read the thesis or independent study report thoroughly to observe the consistency of writing style, depth of content, and accuracy of citations. Pay attention to signals that may indicate unacceptable use of artificial intelligence technology, such as inconsistency in writing style, overly complex language use, or unverifiable citations.
- (2) Check the thesis or independent study report using various artificial intelligence use detection tools, such as Grammarly, GPTZero, ZeroGPT, QuillBot, Copyleaks, Scribbr.

Article 11: During the examination, the Thesis or Independent Study Examination Committee should pose questions and observations to test the student's genuine understanding in the following areas:

- (1) Conceptual and Research Methodology Aspect: Have the student explain the rationale for choosing the theoretical framework, limitations of the framework, details of data collection procedures, problems encountered during the work, and reasons for choosing data analysis methods.
- (2) Research Results and Analysis Aspect: Have the student explain the significant research findings, differences from initial hypotheses, connections to specific contexts, and practical recommendations.
- (3) Use of Artificial Intelligence Technology Aspect: Inquire about the details of artificial intelligence technology use as provided in the form attached to this announcement, the process for verifying the accuracy of its use, and how to distinguish which parts are the student's direct analytical thinking.
- (4) Presentation Aspect: Observe the student's confidence, fluency, and ability to explain details, as well as the consistency between the language level in the thesis or independent study report and the oral presentation. Consider the depth, ownership of the work, and appropriateness of acceptable artificial intelligence technology use.

Article 12: If the Thesis or Independent Study Examination Committee detects an unacceptable use of artificial intelligence technology, the Committee may assign a "Fail" grade for the thesis or independent study examination and forward the matter to the program for further disciplinary action consideration. Unless it is only a minor error not affecting academic quality, the Committee shall have the student correct it to be free of unacceptable artificial intelligence technology use, under the supervision of the advisor, and then schedule a new thesis or independent study examination.

Part 5

Student Disciplinary Proceedings

Article 13: The Dean, with the approval of the Faculty Executive Committee, may announce the establishment of faculty-specific guidelines for using artificial intelligence technology, exercising authority under Clause 7, Paragraph 4 of the Chulalongkorn University Regulations on Higher Education Studies, B.E. 2566 (2023); Clause 8, Paragraph 2 of the Chulalongkorn University Regulations on Graduate Studies, B.E. 2561 (2018) in conjunction with Clause 134, Paragraph 1 of the Chulalongkorn University Regulations on Higher Education Studies, B.E. 2566 (2023); and Clause 8, Paragraph 2 of the Chulalongkorn University Regulations on Graduate Studies, B.E. 2551 (2008) in conjunction with Clause 134, Paragraph 1 of the

Chulalongkorn University Regulations on Higher Education Studies, B.E. 2566 (2023). The details should include, for example:

- (1) Methods for acceptable use of artificial intelligence technology.
- (2) Proportion of acceptable artificial intelligence technology use.
- (3) Citation methods for acceptable artificial intelligence technology use.
- (4) Examples of unacceptable artificial intelligence technology use.
- (5) Methods for observing unacceptable artificial intelligence technology use.
- (6) Tools for checking artificial intelligence technology use.

The establishment of guidelines according to the first paragraph should consider the university's principles and guidelines for artificial intelligence technology use, research ethics, the identity of the Faculty's or Program's discipline, the influence of artificial intelligence technology on theses or independent studies in each program, and other relevant factors.

Article 14: In case it appears to the program that there has been an unacceptable use of artificial intelligence technology, the program shall submit the matter to the Dean to proceed with considering disciplinary action against the student as an act of committing other academic offenses, exercising authority under Clause 61 of the Chulalongkorn University Regulations on Undergraduate Studies, B.E. 2565 (2022).

In case the Chulalongkorn University Regulations on Academic Offenses have been announced and are in effect, disciplinary action against the student shall be considered based on authority under those regulations instead.

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Dean of the Graduate School
